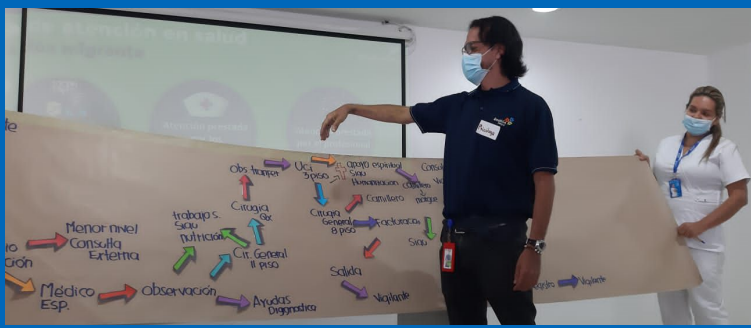


Preventing discrimination in migrant communities is our commitment.

Grant's objective



Strengthening the implementation of the Gender Equality and Social Inclusion approach (GESI) and xenophobia prevention through providing health services with a differential approach to the migrant population in Colombia.

is a strategy for capacity building and knowledge strengthening in GESI, human rights, and xenophobia prevention aimed at

20 Service Provider Institutions (IPS)



With 4 projects



- Training the 20 IPS on the following topics: gender approach, xenophobia prevention, and social inclusion.
- Support in the development of GESI work plans in the 20 IPS.
- Intersectoral work tables to strengthen GESI in the 7 cities where the project operates.
- Promoting collaborative work networks between the CBOs and the entities involved in this process in each territory.

What have we achieved?

- We have established contact with the 7 territorial entities with whom we have jointly selected the IPS to accompany this project.
- We have started the first training process in 7 IPS, benefitting 142 people corresponding to 125 IPS workers (administrative, human talent in health, and surveillance and support personnel), 11 Venezuelan migrants, and 6 people from host communities.
